02 March 2020, New York – The Philippine Consulate General in New Yorkhosted a Focus Group Discussion on "Insurgency Situation in the Philippines and Other Updates" on 28 February 2020 at the Philippine Center New York's Kalayaan Hall.

Hon. Antonio L. Bautista, Assistant Secretary for Human Resource of the Department of National Defense (DND), discussed the current security situation in the Philippines. He also shared the government strategies in combatting insurgencies such as building more infrastructure projects in order to reach remote areas.
